2010-2011 President's Statement

As read at the UUCE Annual Meeting on June 26th

Dear Friends and Members of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Evansville, I'm sorry I'm not able to join you tonight - I am still recuperating from "undercarriage work". I'm not fond of talking on the telephone, but if you would like to e-mail me or come visit, that would be great.

This is not going to be a typical recounting of what the board has done this year - you've all been involved in congregational meetings, consultant survey, and have been welcome to attend board meetings and read board meeting minutes - our records and decisions have been open to all. This has been a couple of years unlike any we have ever experienced before, so this "President's Statement" is unlike any we've heard before. Rather, it's more of a personal reflection on our past and future.

I have a very favorite poster by Mary Engelbreit, titled "Don't Look Back". A person has come to a fork in the road - the sign pointing right says "No Longer An Option". The sign pointing left says "Your Life". The traveler has begun to follow the road on the left.

Life is full of so many

changes. The changes we are excited about and the changes that fill us with dread all involve loss of some kind - friends, job, where you live, what you do, how you view yourself and others, etc. but you just can't continue to focus on what you once had or what might have been. It's better to keep the good memories close, learn from your mistakes and disappoint-



ments, integrate them into your entire life experience, and don't get bogged down, but head on to new adventures. Actually, the loss of the old and familiar enriches the gain of the new and unknown. For example, this has been a hard couple of years for me personally as president of the church board. I've made mistakes, of course, in handling things, as have several others, even though we acted in good faith. But now, it's time

to focus on a different path - a new adventure, a new beginning.

I have every confidence in our congregation becoming unified once again in facing these new challenges of our future. My personal opinion is that we should be lay-led and get our financial affairs in order. Once we have established some financial stability, we can once again search for a minister. So, in this particular instance, the poster says to me: "No Longer An Option" - we cannot afford a full-time minister right now.

"Your Life" - where we are headed as a congregation - working together to become financially stable once again and then to explore the feasibility of hiring a minister. We must be open and adventurous, and create a new beginning. And, to paraphrase my favorite quote by Margaret Mead: "Never doubt that a group of thoughtful, committed UU's can change their congregation - indeed, it's the only thing that ever has."

 During the discussion, she mentioned the broken dreams that we now experience and we suggested that she might share her statement with our congregation, hence this open letter from Rev. Dr. Lisa Presley:

Dear Good People of the UU Church of Evansville,

Recently, I had the opportunity to meet with your Board and discuss with them your ministerial transition, and all that has happened this past year. In speaking with them, I realized that there's one thing that binds you all together during this transition: that you all have broken dreams.

I would venture that none of you, minister or congregant, would have scripted this ending to Deane's ministry with you. When she came, you all hoped and believed that your time together would be terrific - that you would grow and thrive together in

many ways, numerically, maturationally and organically. You had dreams of what you could be together, minister and congregation, congregation and minister. All of you have had your dreams denied, and many of you your hearts broken.

This is what happens every time we care deeply about something that does not live up to our desires - we find ourselves mourning what could have been as much as what actually was. So in a strange way, beneath and fully present in your congregation, is the shared loss of what you wished for. I hope that you remember this as you chart together your future.
